## Public Comment Speakers are reminded of the 10 minute time allotment

Curt Muffley - asked if body cameras were included in the 2020 proposed budget. Chairman Rinaldi responded no but efforts will be made to have all Twp. vehicles equipped with cameras. Asked if the Twp. considered leasing vehicles vs. purchasing. Supervisors responded that with the mileage the police put on the vehicles it might be more cost effective to own. Mr. Bonita has explored both possibilities and has concluded that since the Twp. has the money it is better to own.

Megan Galonis - (a) questioned the 3 1/2% pay raise. Asked if the Twp. performed employee valuations to determine merit raises. Mr. Bonita stated that workers either have individual employment contracts or are covered by collective bargaining which sets the % of pay increases. (b) asked about the PDOT Grant and as told that the project would probably not be done until late 2020 or 2021; (c) stated that the Twp. should find money to help the 106 residents affected by the sewer project. Mr. Galonis stated that he feels that Mike Amato should be fired and not used by the Twp. as engineer.

Ron Kielb - move the line before the cost in the future bankrupts the Twp. Commented on \$2,000,000 lawsuit, sale of sewer system and GeoScience report. Questioned as to whether or not the Twp. is working for a solution to the existing sewer problems. Wants to make sure the Twp. realizes that they are ultimately responsible for the project and will be held accountable to DEP. Wanted the audience to know that there were Notices of Violation issued by DEP and wanted to know the responses by the Supervisors. No comments were made by the Supervisors.
