ORDINANCE NO. 5-01 of 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PITTSTON, LUZERNE COUNTY
PENNSYLVANIA, ESTABLISHING ADDITIONAL STOP INTERSECTIONS ON
TOWNSHIP ROADS WITHIN THE STAUFFER POINTE DEVELOPMENT
AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, under sections 607 and 1506 of the Second-Class Township Code, the Board of Supervisors of are charged with the general governance of the Township in order to, among other things, secure the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the Township and may adopt any ordinances, bylaws, rules and regulations necessary therefore, so long as they are not inconsistent with or restrained by the Constitution and laws of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania; and

WHEREAS, Section 2327 of the Second Class Township Code (53 P.S. § 67327) authorizes the Board of Supervisors to regulate and erect traffic signals on public roads within the Township by Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors after careful review and upon the recommendation of the Township Engineer has determined that the health, safety and general welfare of the residents of Stauffer Pointe as well as those travelling upon the roads of Stauffer Pointe will be served by the installation of additional stop signs as set forth in the Ordinance.

NOW THEREFORE, BE AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED AND ENACTED by the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Pittston, Luzerne County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

Section 1. Sign Location. Stop signs shall be located, erected and maintained by the Township at the following intersections of Township owned roads:

Stop Street	Intersection/Through Street	Direction of Travel
Grandview Drive	Grandview Drive	East
Grandview Drive	Grandview Drive	South

A copy of a map depicting the Stop Sign Locations is appended as Exhibit "A".

Section 2. Sign Placement. Stop signs, mounting posts and location of same shall conform to all current Pennsylvania Department of Transportation regulations.

Section 3. Violations and Enforcement. Violations of this Ordinance shall be enforced in accordance with the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (75 P.S. § 101, et seq.). This Ordinance shall be enforced by the Pittston Township Police Department.

Section 4. Additional Signs. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be in addition to and not in replacement of any other Township Ordinance establishing stop signs within the Township.


Section 5. Severability. The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, invalid, unenforceable or beyond the power of the Township of Pittston, said provision or provisions shall not be construed to affect the validity of any of the remaining portions of this Ordinance. It is hereby declared as the intent of the Supervisors of the Township of Pittston that this Ordinance would have been adopted had such unconstitutional, invalid or unauthorized provision or provisions not been included therein.

Section 6. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the erection of the stop signs as set forth herein.

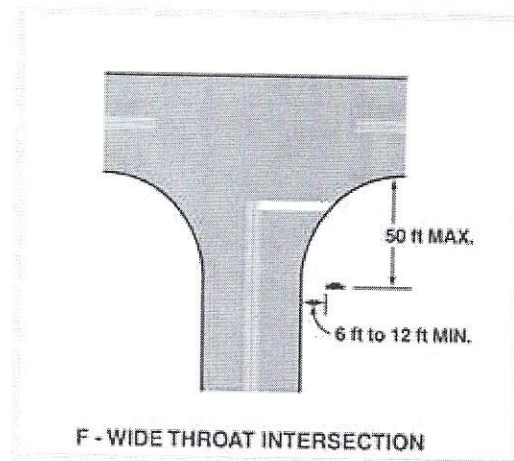
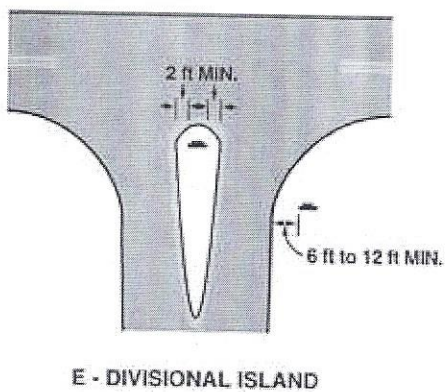
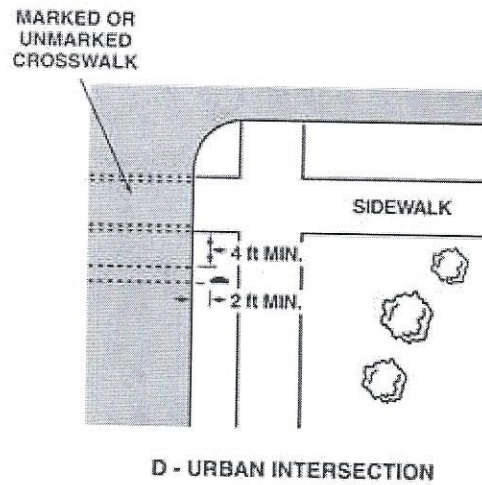
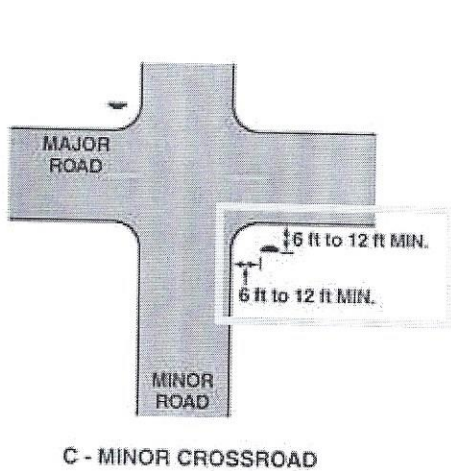
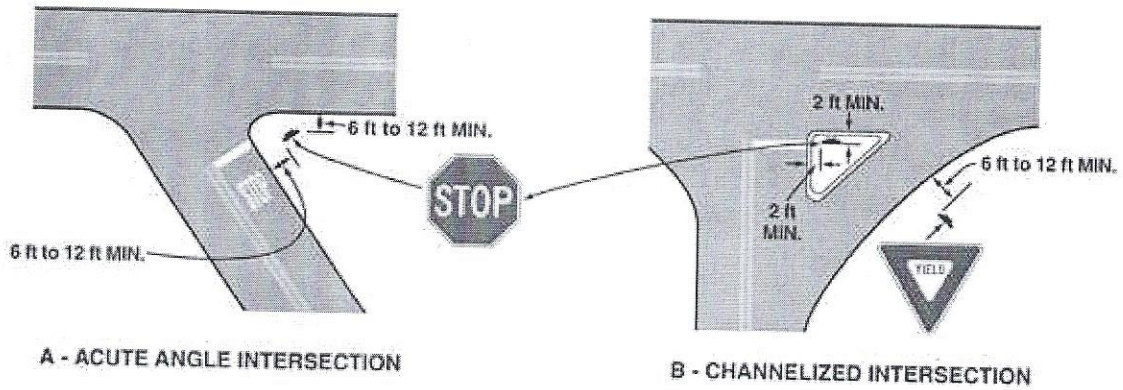

Figure 2A-3. Examples of Locations for Some Typical Signs at Intersections



Note: Lateral offset is a minimum of 6 feet measured from the edge of the shoulder, or 12 feet measured from the edge of the traveled way. See Section 2A.19 for lower minimums that may be used in urban areas, or where lateral offset space is limited.
