PUBLIC TESTIMONY

Joe Antal—

Joe Antal had some inquiries on the plans. He inquired on where the guiderail will be, if there will be continuous curbing from Phase I, about the water runoff down the east side of the road. Mr. Antal also requested a couple of catch basins around his property during construction.

Bob Naegele answered that the guiderail will be right across from his residence on one side. He also answered that there will be continuous curbing from Phase I and that the intention is to push the water in the pipe from Phase I to Baker Road and tap into the existing swales there. Mr. Naegele also said he will revise the plans slightly to include the catch basins.

Mr. Salvo questioned whether the new road will be a straight line. He also inquired whether it will be 33' feet on the right of way.

Mr. Gallagher questioned what will happen to the front of his property that was previously destroyed.

Supervisor Slezak responded it will be dressed up during construction so the front of his property will be neater.

Joyce Salvo—

Ms. Salvo questioned if there will be clearance on each side of the road as she was concerned if it will be a public safety issue if there wasn't.

Supervisor Hawk stated there should be clearance and if there is a public safety issue, it will be addressed and removed.

Patricia Popielarz—

Ms. Popielarz inquired if residents will be allowed and able to pull out of their driveway during the construction period.

Mr. Naegele stated they will put in the construction contract that the contractor has to allow individuals out of driveway while under construction.
