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Pittston Township a Recipient of a 2024 Statewide LSA Grant

Pittston Township was a recipient of a 2024 statewide LSA grant in the amount of \$31,958 for renovations to the Pittston Township Municipal Building. Renovations to the building will include a new roof and installation of new windows. The township would like to thank Rep. Haddock and Sen. PennDOT Approved a Tractor Trailer Prohibition on Tedrick Street

Pittston Township put in a request to PennDOT in December for them to conduct a traffic study for them to consider a tractor trailer prohibition on Tedrick Street, which has been an issue for many years. After conducting the study, PennDOT has approved a tractor trailer prohibition on Tedrick Street from the Bypass to the E. Columbus Ave. intersection. PennDOT is proceeding with ordering and installing the signs in Spring 2026 when warmer weather comes around.

William Street Project Update

Work is continuing on the William Street project. Multiscape, Inc. was on site on Wednesday, January 14th to continue road repairs. The township received a few calls regarding a low dip coming from a strip of road in the area of William and Law Street. Multiscape came in and was able to repair that as well. Road paving and other work will continue once the weather gets warmer.

Parnell Street Project Update

The township and township engineers met with American Asphalt on Friday to go over the punch list for the project. There are some punch list items that could be done currently and some have to be done when the weather warms up. We are hoping the project will be fully completed and punch list items to be fully addressed by the end of Spring 2026.

The Township cannot legally (and please confirm with your solicitor) enforce or require pre-regulation systems to be replaced if there is no Township ordinance requirement or evidence of a regulatory malfunction or discharge. DEP and the Township have investigated and have

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not found evidence of odor or violation therefore nothing can be enforced. Please notify the township when there is a suspected violation and we will continue to investigate.

He further questioned about a burn barrel up on Decker Lane, and made inquiries about the Little League stormwater project.

Carla Dietrick—

Ms. Dietrick commented on the speeding and running of stop sign on Sterling Street in Pittston Township, and requested more patrols in area.

Don Hudzinski—

Mr. Hudzinski commented on highlights of the year-end ambulance report for 2025.
