Consideration of Ordinance 7-03 of 2026—Controlling of Feral Cats in Pittston Township

An ordinance to control feral cats is being considered by the supervisors. Controlling of feral cats have been a long-standing issue all around Pittston Township. The ordinance would require registration of community cat caregivers and require these caregivers to abide by the requirements in the ordinance and would require compliance with a trap, vaccinate, neuter, and release program. Any violations of this ordinance would result in fines. Introduction of Ordinance of Transferring Undeveloped Land in Stauffer Pointe Development from Pittston Township to Pittston City

An ordinance is being introduced tonight to transfer approximately 22.31 acres of land from Pittston Township to the City of Pittston in the Stauffer Pointe Development. The territory being considered for transfer is located in Stauffer Pointe Development and is generally bounded by Center Street, Valley View Terrace, and the existing boundary line of Pittston City and Pittston Township with the nearest streets to the borderline being Butler Street and Hunter Street. Any taxpayers or residents currently residing in Pittston Township will remain within the boundary line of Pittston Township and remain residents of Pittston Township. The ordinance is not being considered for enactment tonight, only an introduction. Public hearings are being scheduled to hear from the public on the transfer of land.

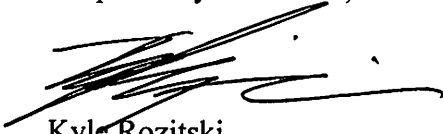
